- I'm most interested in the plaza being landscaped and beautified. There is a beautiful spot underneath the 280 freeway at Indiana between 24th and 23d that is so nice one hardly notices the freeway overhead.
- Dog area? I don't know if the space is large enough to have both a dog area and a children's playground—the two don't mix well unless they can be separated. I thought of this because the only people I see taking walks in the neighborhood (instead of just walking home from the bus stop or from Third Street) are people walking their dogs.
- Could hold SPCA mobile dog vaccination clinics here, as well.
- Basketball hoop? For the older kids, instead of playground.
- Use native plants, green screen not chain link, use decorative fences and gates not art.
- Provide water & electrical
- 1) No benefit to improvement, instead creating more traffic, cut back parking lots, could use money for better project for the community. 2) The project doesn't have the budget to implement the construction.
- Add a stop light for pedestrians to cross at all "T" intersections and intersections.
- Creation of Friends of Jennings Plaza with membership drawn from defined groups, such as immediate neighbors and local plant nurseries.
- Involvement of local plant nurseries: The Bayview has several: Flora Grub Gardens, Bay Natives, Literacy for Environmental Justice, and Flowercraft.
- Flora Grub has made vertical gardens a specialty. A "green screen" at this location might be an interesting challenge for them.
