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3	[PROPOSED] Refuse Collection and Disposal Rate Board Resolution regarding the
4	Abandoned Materials Collection ("AMC") Program; and adopting findings on uses of
5	the Special Reserve Fund.
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7	WHEREAS, The 1932 Refuse Collection and Disposal Ordinance, as amended,
8	establishes and governs the process for approving residential refuse collection and
9	disposal rates for the City and County of San Francisco ("City"); and,
10	WHEREAS, On March 14, 2013, Recology Sunset Scavenger, Recology Golden
11	Gate, and Recology San Francisco ("Recology") filed an Application with the City
12	Administrator requesting an increase in the Companies' residential refuse collection and
13	disposal rates ("the 2013 Rate Application"); and,
14	WHEREAS, On July 23, 2013, the Rate Board issued a Resolution and Order on
15	Director of Public Works' Recommended Orders on the 2013 Rate Application; and
16	WHEREAS, The Rate Board requested in its July 23, 2013 Resolution and Order
17	that the Director of Public Works, prior to November 1, 2015, submit a report regarding the
18	effectiveness of the Abandoned Materials Collection ("AMC") pilot program in diverting
19	materials from landfill in a cost effective manner, consistent with the City's goal of zero
20	waste; and
21	WHEREAS, On October 30, 2015, the Director of Public Works submitted a report
22	regarding the AMC Program consistent with the Rate Board's July 23, 2013 Resolution and
23	Order, in which the Director concluded that the AMC Program has resulted in an increase
24	in diversion from landfill in a cost-effective manner; and

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1	WHEREAS, The Rate Board requested in its July 23, 2013 Resolution and Order a
2	report on the Special Reserve Fund ("Fund") identifying all contributions to and
3	expenditures from the Fund since its inception, and an assessment of future conditions that
4	may require use of the Fund; and
5	WHEREAS, On October 30, 2015, the Director of Public Works submitted a report
6	from the Department of the Environment on the Fund addressing the request of the Rate
7	Board in its July 23, 2013 Resolution and Order and proposing certain distributions from the
8	Fund; and
9	WHEREAS, The Rate Board, consisting of Chair/Deputy City Administrator Jennifer
10	Johnston, Member/Controller Ben Rosenfield, and Member/San Francisco Public Utilities
11	Commission Deputy General Manager Michael P. Carlin, convened a public hearing on the
12	reports on December 16, 2015; and
13	WHEREAS, Upon consideration and discussion following presentations of the
14	reports at the December 16, 2015, hearing, the Rate Board has recommendations
15	concerning the Abandoned Materials Collection Program and the Special Reserve Fund;
16	now, therefore, be it
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18	RESOLVED, That the Rate Board takes the following actions and adopts the
19	following findings:
20	1. Regarding the AMC Program:
21	A. The Rate Board finds that the AMC Program has resulted in an increase in
22	diversion from landfill of materials, consistent with achieving the City's goal of zero waste,

B. Based on this finding, the AMC Program shall be continued beyond June

30, 2016, at the same rates as in the pilot program, subject to any adjustments authorized

in a cost-effective manner.

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1 2. Regarding the Special Reserve Fund: 2 A. The Rate Board finds, for purposes of Section 5 of the 1987 Agreement in 3 Facilitation of Waste Disposal between the City and Sanitary Fill Company (now Recology 4 San Francisco), that there is a continuing need for \$13.85 million in the Special Reserve 5 Fund, and the remaining monies in the Fund may be and are allocated for the benefit of 6 current and future ratepayers and commercial accounts of the City's refuse collection 7 companies. 8 B. The Rate Board finds that the Department of the Environment's proposed 9 distributions from the Fund are consistent with the intended uses of the Fund and benefit 10 the ratepayers. 11 C. The Rate Board concurs with the Department of the Environment's 12 proposed distributions from the Fund, including: 13 i. Transfer \$3.75 million to a new Reserve Fund (created pursuant to the 14 Landfill Disposal Agreement between the City and County of San Francisco and Recology 15 San Francisco ("Landfill Disposal Agreement"), dated July 22, 2015) to provide for initial 16 funding of the Reserve Fund; 17 ii. Transfer \$12.0 million to a new Reserve Fund to be used to cover the 18 incremental cost of hauling and disposing of City waste under the Landfill Disposal 19 Agreement; and 20 /// 21 /// 22 /// 23 111 24 111 25

in the Rate Orders.

1	iii. Retain \$13.85 million (the balance) in the existing Special Reserve
2	Fund until such time as the Rate Board determines that there is no need for the Fund, at
3	which time the remaining monies must be used to the benefit of ratepayers.
