FEE WAIVER

You can get a waiver for some or most of your permit fee. You do not need to pay all of your permit fee if you can show that you get any of the following:

- California State Medi-Cal
- Electronic Benefits Transfer (EBT)
- SFMTA Lifeline Card
- Women Infant and Children (WIC) Benefits

You can get the first-year permit fee waived, and renewal fees reduced, if you make less than 200% of the federal poverty rate a year.
