

Third Street Bridge Rehabilitation Project Temporary Full Bridge Closure Notification

Dear Resident / Business Owner,

As part of the Third Street Bridge Rehabilitation Project (Contract Number 1000007012) to facilitate the remaining construction activities of the Third Street Bridge, "Lefty O'Doul Bridge", located just south of Oracle Park on Third Street, American Bridge Company has scheduled a Temporary Full Bridge Closure from 7:00PM on July 07, 2019 to 11:59PM on July 17, 2019.

The work to be performed during the Closure includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- Blasting and painting of structural steel
- Installation of new structural steel
- Installation of new pedestrian walkway
- Installation and removal of temporary scaffolding
 Installation of certain new mechanical items
- Demolition of bridge decking
- Bolting and welding of steel components
- Installation of certain new electrical items

Every effort will be made by the contractor to minimize construction related noise impacts during nighttime work, but please note that general construction related noise from the use of heavy equipment such as forklifts and generators and manual hammering to secure scaffolding, is to be expected.
