Then bid on our upcoming contracts!

We can help you become a City vendor and explain the bidding process.



It's really not that hard to get started to become a City vendor and bid on our tree contracts.

At the time of bid, all you need is a

- ◆ Tree Service Contractor (D-49) or Landscaping Contractor (C-27) license with the State of California
- ◆ Current California Department of Industrial Relations [registration](#)
- ◆ Valid bid bond (If needed the City has a bond assistance [program](#))
- ◆ And, if you are a small San Francisco based business, a [Local Business Enterprise](#) certification

Public Works contracts are advertised [here](#) and on the citywide [site](#).

Our past tree contracts have provided \$125 - \$200 an hour depending on the services.

If you're the apparent low bidder, before the contract is awarded, you must

- ◆ Have a [San Francisco Business Tax](#) number
- ◆ Set up a [City vendor profile](#)
- ◆ Get set up in the City's [electronic payment systems](#)
- ◆ Be compliant with the City's [12B Equal Benefits Ordinance](#)
- ◆ Provide a Payment and Performance bond and insurance certificates

Then you can start helping us care for our beautiful urban forest!
