2024 Healthy, Safe and Vibrant San Francisco Bond

A proposed 2024 Healthy, Safe and Vibrant San Francisco Bond will relocate San Francisco City Clinic (SFCC) to a building optimized for health care, expanding services and making it more accessible and safer for patients. The new clinic space will improve the sexual health outcomes of patients by expanding lab functions for on-site test results processing and same-day diagnosis, strengthen coordinated care with other needed services, ensure faster and more streamlined services, and improve ADA accessibility. SFCC currently operates out of a converted firehouse that was not built for patient care.

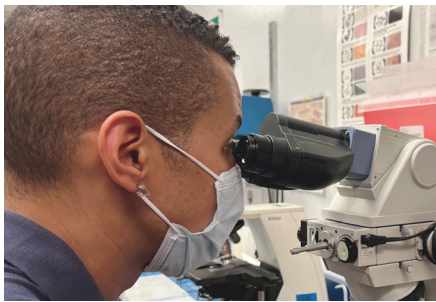

Care for Sexual Health and More

SFCC is a key part of the City’s commitment to reduce new HIV infections in San Francisco and is a national model in sexual health services. SFCC is often the first line of defense to stop or slow the spread of sexually transmitted infections (STIs) in the community. The clinic diagnoses 10 percent of all syphilis, gonorrhea, chlamydia and HIV cases citywide – immediately treating HIV and other STIs and preventing unintended pregnancy.

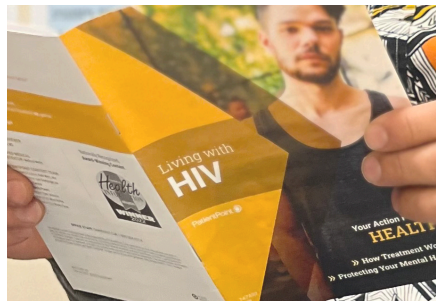
On-Site Lab



Point-of-care testing means patients can walk in, get tested for infections, such as syphilis, gonorrhea, chlamydia, HIV and Hep C, and get results and treatment the same day, so they feel better sooner and are less likely to infect others.

A better lab space will allow SFCC to use newer equipment and process more tests faster.

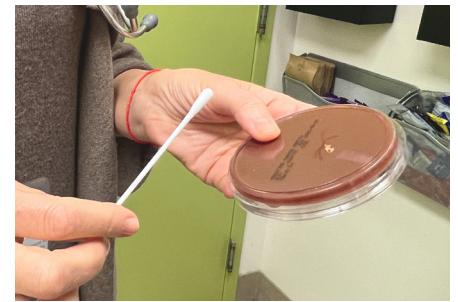
HIV Prevention & Care



Treatment with PrEP reduces risk of contracting HIV from sex by 99% when taken as prescribed. Because SFCC sees walk-in patients, it makes PrEP available to the most underserved populations.

A clinic optimized for patient care will improve accessibility and help serve more patients.

Research



Contributes to critical advances in the public health study of STI and HIV epidemiology, testing and treatment - making San Francisco a national public health model, hosting national studies, including for the HIV prevention drug PrEP, bacterial infection drug Doxy-PEP, and new treatments for gonorrhea.
