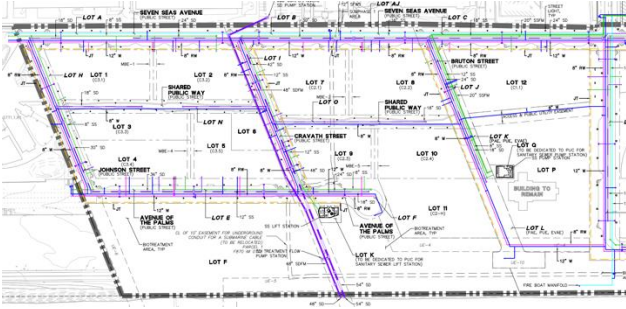

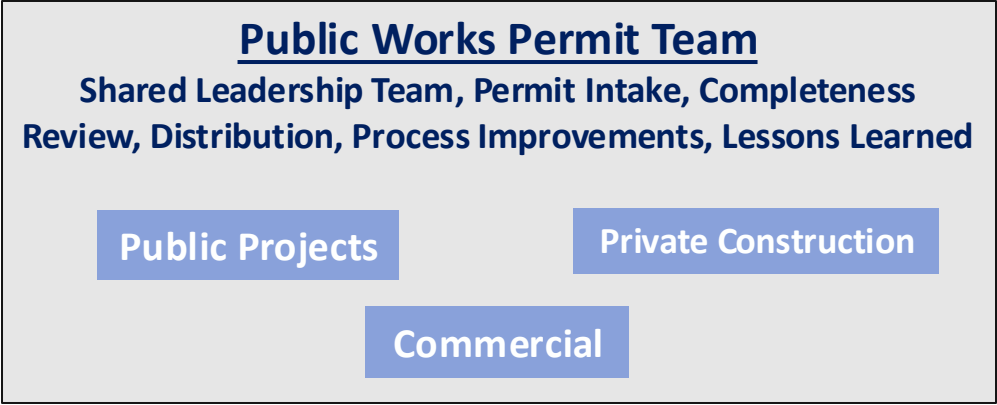

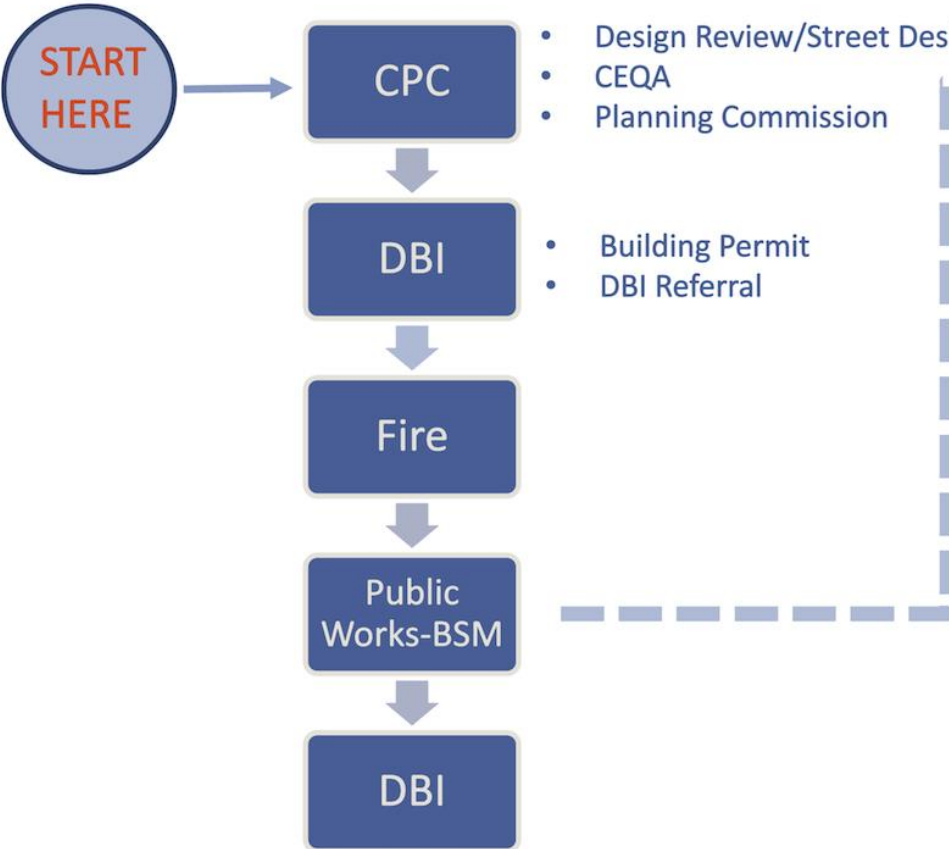
Public Projects

- City Projects**
 Ex: Capital Projects from RPD, Public Works, MTA, PUC, SFFD, Caltrans, etc.
- Publicly-Funded Projects**
 Ex: 100% Affordable Housing, Grant Funded Projects, UCSF Campus, etc.
- Priority Development Projects**
 Ex: Major Downtown Infill Development, High-profile Residential Towers and Mixed-use Commercial Buildings, Senior Housing, etc.
- Private Sector Permits: Private Construction & Commercial**
 Ex: All Other ROW Projects, Third Party Utilities, Tables & Chairs, Love our Neighborhood, Downtown Activation, Street Closures, etc.

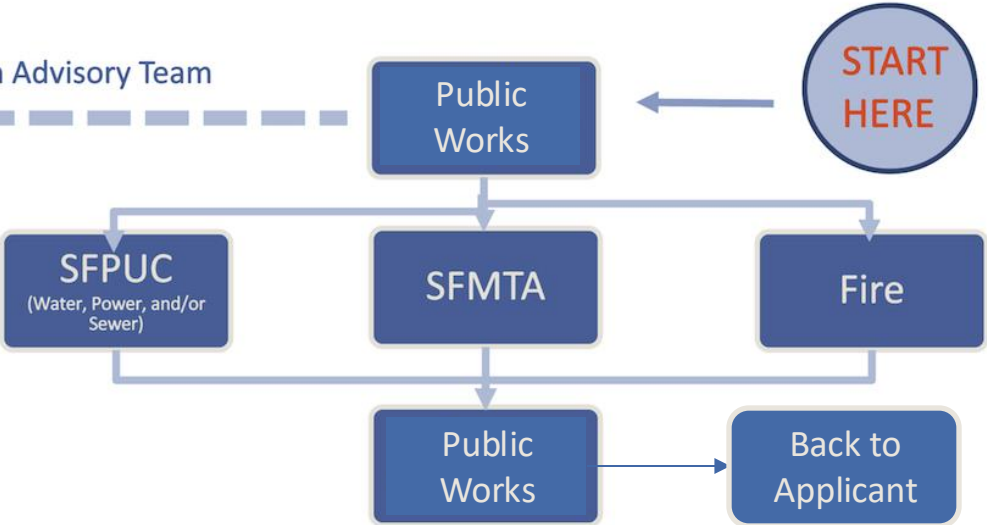

Examples of BSM Permits that result from DBI Permits:

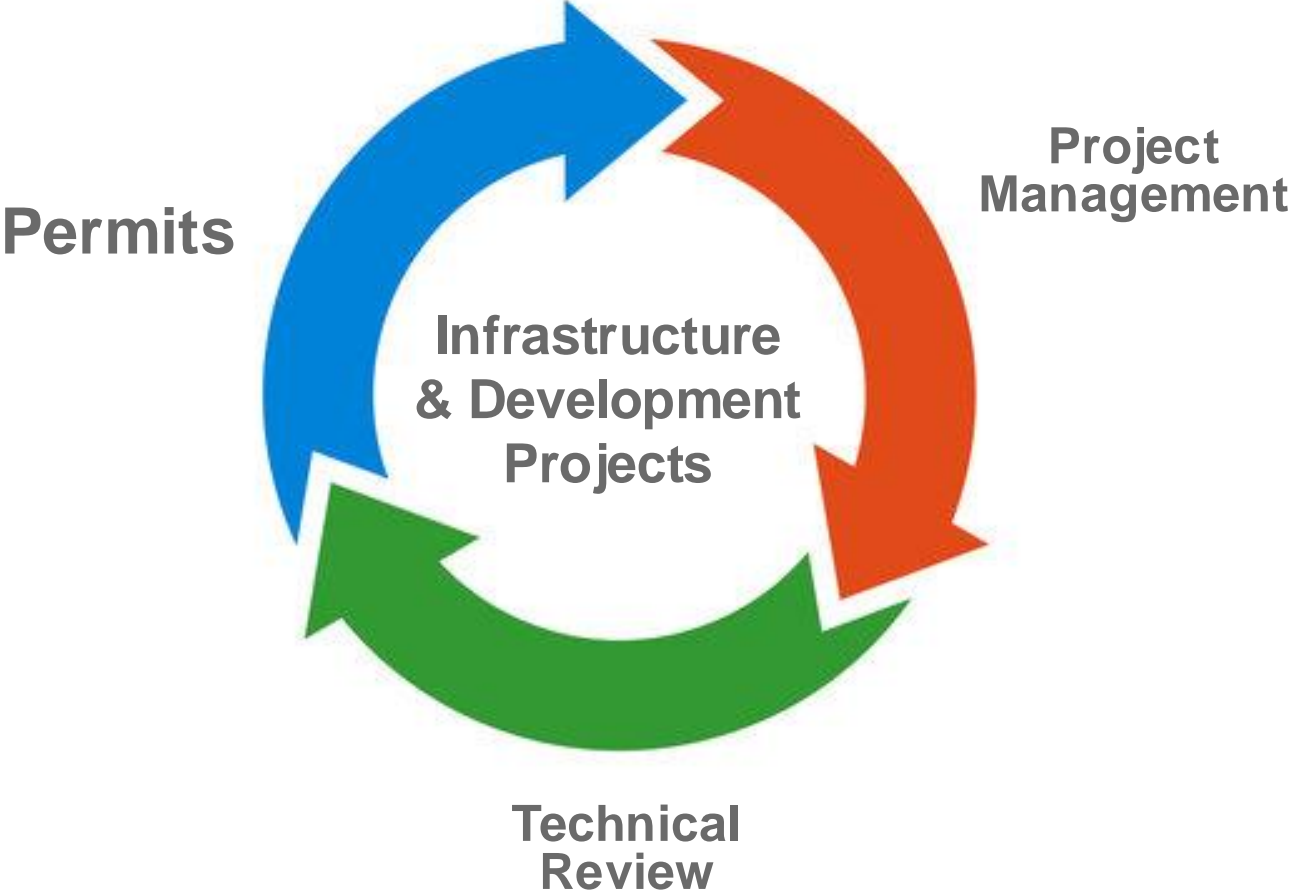
- Vaults (to provide new/upgraded power)
- Street Improvement
- Minor Encroachments (accessibility, historic encroachments, fire stub out, gas meters)
- Side Sewer
- Street Space/Additional Street Space (for construction staging, providing path of travel, etc.)

Recent and Ongoing Process Improvements

1. Established and published Minimum Completeness Standards and Pre-application Checklists
2. Created a Completeness Check process
3. Created dedicated and focused permit teams for public projects, private construction, and commercial permits
4. Improving the interagency plan check process
5. Moving all plan reviews to an electronic format (Bluebeam)
6. Implementing Clariti and creating public dashboards
7. Standardizing design, construction, and acceptance requirements and processes
8. Documenting and applying lessons learned across projects
9. Improving Permits webpage
10. Working with the Mayor's PermitSF team on 100-day Initiatives
