



PROGRAM OVERVIEW:

During the summer of 2024, Hunter's Point Family, in partnership with the Department of Public Works (DPW), provided employment and training opportunities for fifty (50) youth. This marked the 18th year of the citywide summer youth employment program. The program offered seven weeks of employment and job readiness training to youth ages 13-19. The youth were employed as Environmental Service Workers and had the opportunity to receive on-the-job training and mentoring from Hunter's Point Family's field supervision team. These efforts were supported by a seasoned group of DPW employees, creating a safe and supportive working environment that kept the participants motivated and engaged over the summer.

This summer, the Department of Public Works (DPW) provided young people with great opportunities to learn new skills in gardening and greening. Hunters Point Family (HPF) had youth working with DPW crews in three zones, an expansion from last year's service model. The youth worked in the Sunset, Western Addition, Glen Park, Portola, and Marina districts of San Francisco. Each crew consisted of 15-17 youth workers, one lead supervisor, and one field supervisor. Over seven weeks, this motivated group of young people worked over 8,000 hours. Their tasks included pruning, weeding and mulching, brush removal, planting, green waste removal, and litter abatement.

HPF worked closely with San Francisco high schools and middle schools this summer in our preprogram outreach. We also engaged our community partners and other providers to create a program representative of our city's richness and the needs of our youth. This year, 28% of our youth were incoming high school students, and 4% were graduating seniors.

Job Readiness Training

All program participants received 12 hours of job readiness training as part of their employment with Hunters Point Family. The job readiness training provided youth with valuable information on workplace etiquette, life skills, conflict resolution, and the proper usage of tools necessary for them to succeed in their summer employment position and their future personal and professional lives.

Areas of focus included:

- Communication
- Teamwork
- Punctuality
- Professionalism
- Problem Solving & Critical Thinking
- Employer Expectations
- Dressing for Success

The job readiness training helped prepare participants for worksite expectations and provided an overview of the summer youth employment program.






