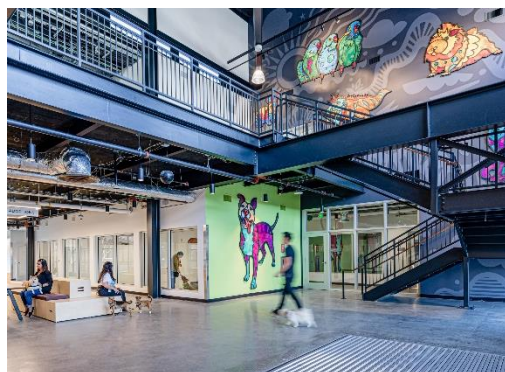

# Historic Rain Totals



## National Weather Service

- NYE was second-wettest day in more than 170 years of records; more than 5.4 inches in 24 hours
- Dec. 26 through Jan. 4 was the wettest 10-day period for SF since 1871; 10.33 inches of rain downtown

Tree removal at Junipero Serra and Sloat streets.





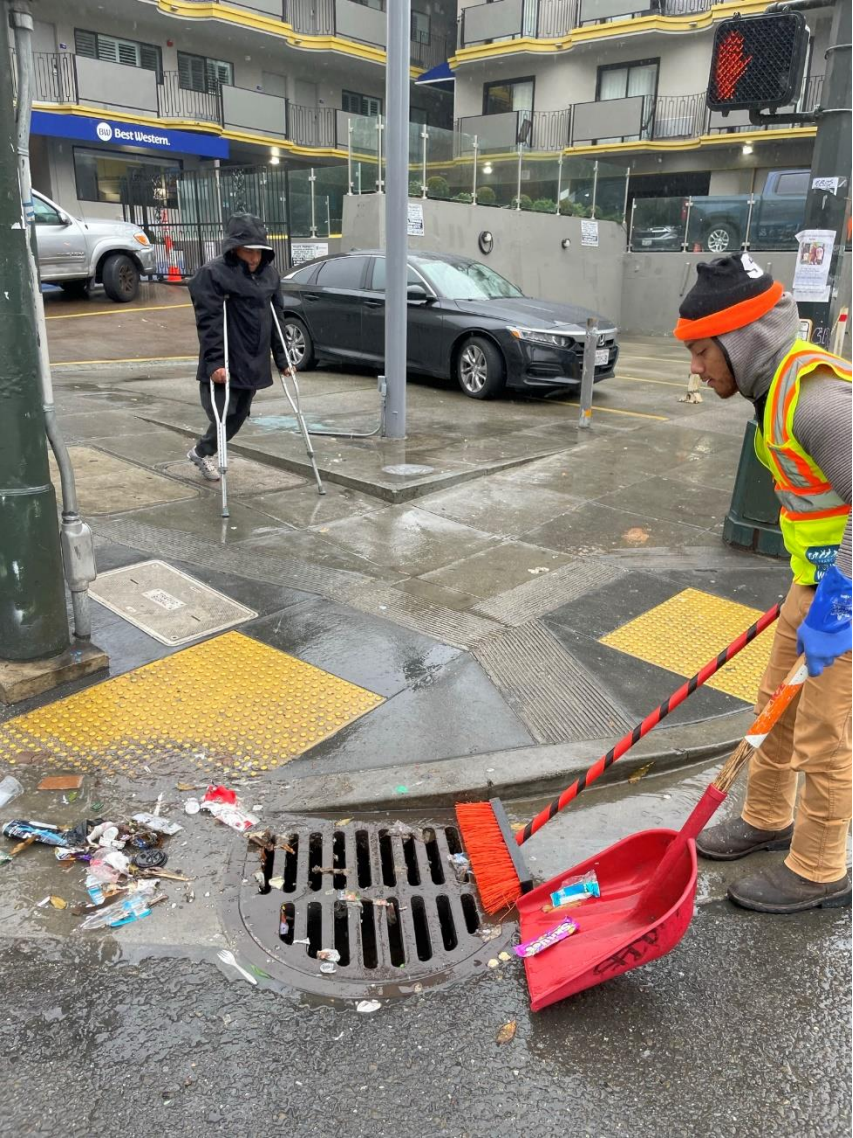
# Night and Day



Downed black acacia, Market and Danvers streets; bucket truck operation, Junipero Serra and Sloat streets.



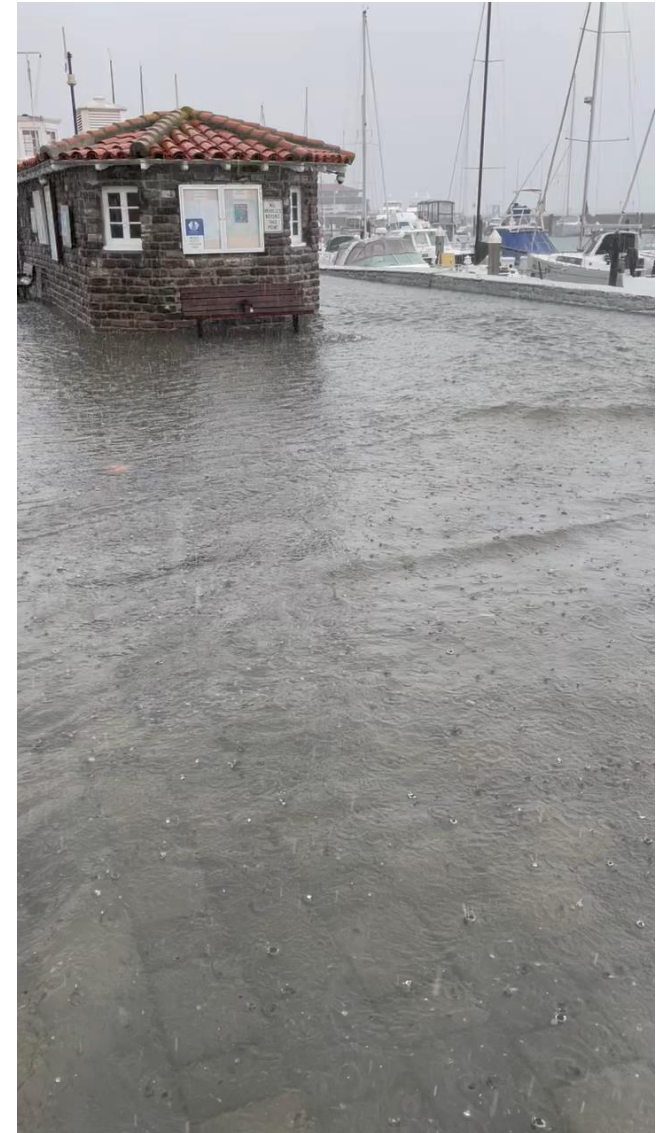
# Clearing Storm Drains and Cleaning Sidewalks

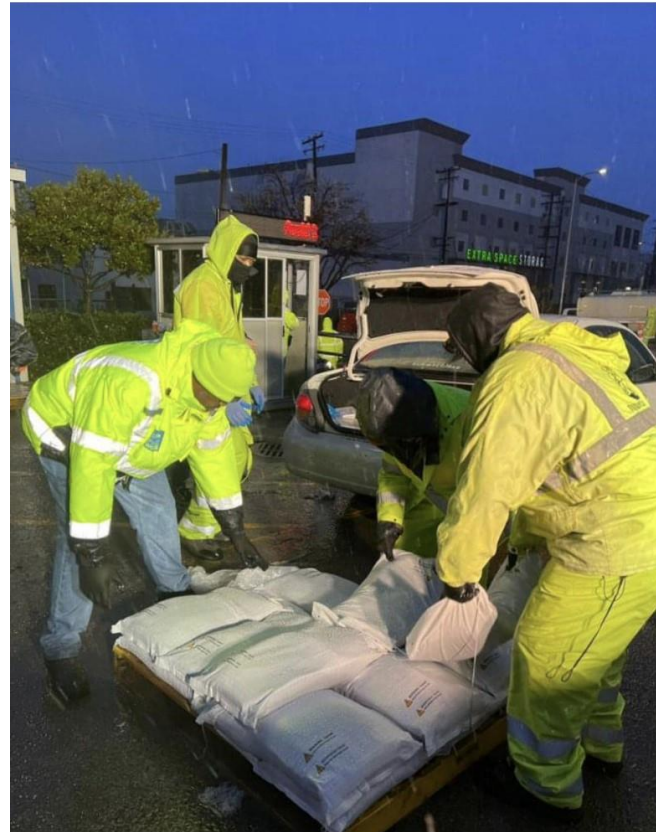
