Subject: Overview of the Infrastructure Design and Construction Division's

Bureau of Street-Use and Mapping

Director's Recommendation: Information item only. Receive and discuss.

Executive Summary: San Francisco Public Works, Infrastructure Design and Construction is comprised of four bureaus among which is the Bureau of Street-Use & Mapping (BSM). BSM is responsible for managing the public right of way (PROW) throughout the entire City. The PROW includes both the street and its sidewalks but can also include alleyways and some public staircases. BSM is comprised of three sections: Permits, Inspections & Enforcement, and Subdivision & Mapping.

The BSM Permit section issues about 35,000 permits per year, which can be grouped into two different categories: Construction (or Engineering-related) and Commercial. The one notable permit type BSM does not issue is traffic permits, which are within the sole purview of the SFMTA.

The BSM Inspection & Enforcement section is SF Public Works' "boots on the ground"; not just because it enforces BSM's permits, but also because it does general code enforcement across the City. Many complaints submitted via 311 get routed through BSM to either determine which agency has purview, or for BSM to coordinate a response because they are interagency related issues.

The BSM Subdivision & Mapping group is led by our County Surveyor and is composed of two different groups: Land Surveying and Subdivision & Mapping. The land surveying group handles surveys for almost all capital projects performed by SF Public Works, but also for the SFPUC, SFMTA, the Port of SF, and several other City agencies. In contrast, the Subdivision & Mapping group performs no surveying. Among its responsibilities is reviewing and approving subdivision maps, condo conversions, lot mergers, plats, and even street vacations and street renaming.


















