**Subject**: Pit Stop Workforce Development Grant Award - Mission Hiring Hall

**Director's Recommendation**: Award the Pit Stop Workforce Development (Pit Stop WFD) Grant to Mission Hiring Hall in a not to exceed amount of \$3,225,834 to provide clean and safe public toilets, used-needle receptacles, and dog waste stations in San Francisco's most impacted neighborhoods and to avoid closure of 11 Pit Stop locations.

**Grant Background**: The Pit Stop WFD Program creates employment opportunities, job training, and workforce development programs while ensuring the availability of safe and clean public restrooms. Pit Stop facilities are staffed by paid attendants who help ensure the bathrooms are well-maintained and used for their intended purpose. This Pit Stop WFD Grant enables the operation of [11] locations that will cease operations as of today if this Pit Stop WFD Grant is not approved. This will result in closure of one-third of the Pit Stop locations throughout San Francisco.

These 11 sites average over 2000 uses/flushes pers week, which translates to over 100,000 uses/flushes annually.

On August 18, 2023, members of this Commission discussed the staff recommendation to award the Pit Stop WFD Grant to Mission Hiring Hall. Since that time, in response to questions raised about this grant recommendation, staff have provided supplemental information.

**Solicitation and Award Process**: Sourcing ID 0000007785 Pit Stop WFD Request for Proposals (RFP) was issued on March 27, 2023, with a May 3, 2023 deadline to submit proposals. Public

Works completed outreach through social media accounts, email to the Department's grant opportunities email list, and posting on the San Francisco City Partner and department websites. On May 3, 2023, Public Works received three proposals for the Pit Stop WFD RFP with an intent to award two grants. City staff reviewed all proposals and determined that three were responsive and responsible. The responsive and responsible proposals were then evaluated and scored by a panel comprised of subject matter experts from San Francisco Public Works and the Office of Economic and Workforce Development. Hunters Point Family was the highest ranked proposal for the Pit Stop WFD RFP and Mission Hiring Hall was the second highest ranked proposal. On June 16, 2023, the Public Works Commission adopted Resolution No. 2023-0060, awarding the Pit Stop Workforce Development Grant to Hunters Point Family in the amount of \$8,425,706.

#### Reason:

Provide clean and safe public toilets, as well as used-needle receptacles and dog waste stations, in San Francisco's most impacted neighborhoods. By staffing Pit Stop facilities, the attendants help ensure that the restrooms are well maintained and used for their intended purpose.

### **Grant Overview and Scope of Work**

**Background**: Support workforce participants in developing careers beyond the program by connecting them to employment and apprenticeship opportunities at Public Works, other public agencies, nonprofit partners and private companies.

**Benefits:** The project provides clean and safe public toilets, used-needle receptacles and dog waste stations in San Francisco's most impacted neighborhoods. All the Pit Stop facilities are staffed by paid attendants who help ensure that the bathrooms are well maintained and used for their intended purpose.

**Details:** The grantee will monitor 11 or more permanent and temporary public toilets in the City to ensure they are kept clean and safe.

**Director's Recommendation**: Award the Pit Stop Workforce Development Contract to Mission Hiring Hall in the amount of \$3,225,834 to provide clean and safe public toilets, used-needle receptacles and dog waste stations in San Francisco's most impacted neighborhoods.




## **Total Pit Stop Locations**
