Subject: Awarding Grant for Tenderloin Clean Workforce Development Program

Director's Recommendation: Award the Tenderloin Clean Workforce Development Contract to North of Market / Tenderloin Community Benefit District for \$2,005,065 to provide litter reduction services in the Tenderloin and adjacent neighborhoods of San Francisco to ensure clean sidewalks and rights-of-way.

Grant Background: Public Works sought and obtained proposals from a nonprofit partner (the "Grantee") to support workforce participants in developing careers beyond the program by connecting them to employment and apprenticeship opportunities at Public Works, other public agencies, non-profit partners, and private companies. Participants in Grantee's workforce development program will provide litter reduction services including sidewalk sweeping, gutter sweeping, litter collection, topping off/remove debris from overflowing City-owned trash receptacles, and litter removal from sidewalk tree wells and planters in the Tenderloin and adjacent neighborhoods of San Francisco to ensure clean sidewalks and rights-of-way. The Grantee will help to identify large refuse items in the rights-of-way and public spaces in the service area and report the item within one hour to the City's designated contact person to arrange for collection and removal. Large refuse items include items left lying in a public space that are too large, bulky, or heavy to be safely lifted or collected by a single person. Grantee will provide daily data collection with weekly reporting to Public Works on litter collection, specifically the volume and specific waste types collected in the Service Area, and daily crew/supervisor numbers; daily tent counts within the service area before 7:00 a.m. Monday through Sunday submitted to the Healthy Streets Operations Center.

Employment Readiness and Job Support Services

Grantee's workforce development program must include:

- Providing workforce development and job training opportunities to San Francisco residents who are eligible to work but face barriers to employment, especially those in economically disadvantaged neighborhoods and communities.
- Conducting workshops and training related to resume writing, job search skills, interview skills, job applications, and using online services to find and apply for jobs, as well as conflict management and de-escalation techniques.
- Connecting participants to employment and apprenticeship opportunities at Public Works, other public agencies, non-profit partners, and private companies.

Solicitation Process: Public Works issued Sourcing ID 0000008389 – Tenderloin Clean Workforce Development RFP on 9/20/2023, with a deadline extended to 10/18/2023 via Addendum No. 1 to submit Proposals. On 10/18/2023, Public Works received two (2) Proposals for the Tenderloin Clean WFD RFP with an intent to award one (1) grant agreement. City staff reviewed all proposals and determined that both were responsive and responsible. The responsive and responsible proposals were then evaluated and scored by a panel comprised of subject matter experts from San Francisco Public Works. Proposer North of Market / Tenderloin Community Benefit District was the highest ranked proposal for the Tenderloin Clean WFD RFP based on the panelist scores.

RESOLUTION NO.
WHEREAS, The Tenderloin Clean Workforce Development Grant (Tenderloin Clean WFD) will provide employment and workforce development opportunities for San Francisco residents who are eligible to work but face barriers to employments, especially those from economically disadvantaged neighborhoods, and
WHEREAS, The Workforce Development Program will include job readiness and soft skills training to assist participants in their transition to the workforce and develop careers beyond the program; and
WHEREAS, Participants will provide litter reduction services in the Tenderloin and adjacent neighborhoods to ensure clean sidewalks and rights-of-way; and
WHEREAS, San Francisco Public Works issued the Tenderloin Clean Workforce Development (WFD) Request for Proposals (RFP) on September 20, 2023; and
WHEREAS, The not-to-exceed grant amount is anticipated to be up to \$2,005,065, and the agreement will have an initial duration of 14 months; and
WHEREAS, Public Works received two proposals for the Tenderloin Clean WFD RFP with the intent to award one grant agreement; and
WHEREAS, City staff found both proposals to be responsible and responsive to the Tenderloin Clean WFD RFP; and
WHEREAS, Both responsive and responsible proposals were evaluated and scored by a panel comprised of subject matter experts for the RFP; and
WHEREAS, North of Market / Tenderloin Community Benefit District ranked first in the Tenderloin Clean WFD RFP based on panelist scores; now, therefore, be it
RESOLVED, That this Commission hereby awards Public Works Grant Tenderloin Clean WFD RFP, in the amount of \$2,005,065, with a duration of 14 months to the North of Market / Tenderloin Community Benefit District.

Grant Overview and Scope of Work

Background: Support workforce participants in developing careers beyond the program by connecting them to employment and apprenticeship opportunities at Public Works, other public agencies, nonprofit partners and private companies.

Benefits: Provide litter reduction services in the Tenderloin and adjacent neighborhoods of San Francisco to ensure clean sidewalks and rights-of-way. Grantee will provide proactive services such as 1) sidewalk sweeping, 2) gutter sweeping, 3) litter collection, 4) topping off/removing debris from overflowing City-owned trash receptacles, and 5) litter removal from sidewalk tree wells and planters. Identify large refuse items in the rightsof-way and public spaces in the Service Area and report the item within one hour to the City's designated contact person to arrange for collection and removal in addition to daily tent counts within the service area before 7:00 a.m. daily and submit the count to the Healthy Streets Operations Center.

Details: Service will be provided in the geographic area of Tenderloin Neighborhood in San Francisco bordered on the north by Sutter Street, the east by Mason Street, the south by McAllister Street, and the west by Van Ness Avenue with a carve out at Taylor and O'Farrell streets.

Director's Recommendation: Award the Tenderloin Clean Workforce Development Contract to Tenderloin Community Benefit District for \$2,005,065 to provide litter reduction services in the Tenderloin and adjacent neighborhoods of San Francisco to ensure clean sidewalks and rights-of-way.
