Director's Recommendation: Award Job Order Construction contract JOC-J63 Electrical [Industrial] Services with a not-to-exceed amount of \$5,000,000 for 730 consecutive calendar days to U.S. Electric Technologies, Inc. Also, authorize the Director of Public Works to approve future modifications to increase the contract duration by up to 1,095 calendar days, to a new total duration of up to 1,825 calendar days, and to increase the not-to-exceed amount by up to \$2,500,000, for a new total not-to-exceed amount of \$7,500,000.

Contract Background: Work is accomplished by issuing Task Orders during the term of the contract. The scope of work may include general electrical work, including medium-voltage 12kV and low-voltage 460V electrical power systems for industrial facilities, and associated work such as demolition, underground raceways, and system integration. The work is performed on an "if-and-as-needed" basis in accordance with the San Francisco Administrative Code Section 6.62 requirements. The initial master agreement term is two years and not-to-exceed amount of \$5,000,000. Per San Francisco Administrative Code section 6.62(g), the Contract Term may be extended up to 5 years but no new Task Orders will be issued after the first 4 years. Per San Francisco Administrative Code section 6.62(f) the not-to-exceed amount of the Contract can be increased 150% of the original contract amount to a not-to-exceed amount of \$7,500,000.

Solicitation Process: The Department readvertised the project on July 10, 2023, and received one bid on August 9, 2023. Staff evaluated the low bid proposal from U.S. Electric Technologies, Inc. and it was determined that:

- 1. The bid was deemed responsive by Public Works Contract Administration staff
- 2. The bidder was deemed responsible by Public Works Project Controls and Services
- 3. The bid received Contract Monitoring Division's award recommendation

WHEREAS, The Work is accomplished by issuing Task Orders during the term of the contract. The scope of work may include general electrical work, including medium-voltage 12kV and low-voltage 460V electrical power systems for industrial facilities, and associated work such as demolition, underground raceways, and system integration; and

WHEREAS, The work is performed on an "if-and-as-needed" basis in accordance with the San Francisco Administrative Code Section 6.62 requirements; and

WHEREAS, The initial not-to-exceed contract amount is \$5,000,000; and

WHEREAS, The initial contract duration is 730 calendars days; and

WHEREAS, On August 9, 2023, Public Works received and opened publicly one bid;

and

WHEREAS, Public Works staff and Contract Monitoring Division (CMD) staff reviewed the bids and determined that U.S. Electric Technologies, Inc. is a responsive and responsible bidder that submitted the lowest responsive bid; and

WHEREAS, CMD established a Local Business Enterprise (LBE) subcontracting participation requirement of 20% for this contract, and the contractor committed to LBE participation of 20% in its bid submittal; and

WHEREAS, The Director recommends the Commission's approval of the initial not-toexceed contract amount and the initial contract duration referenced above as well as the Commission's approval of an increase of up to 1,095 calendar days to the contract duration contingency and an increase of up to \$2,500,000 to the not-to-exceed amount contingency; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That this Commission hereby awards Public Works Construction Contract, JOC-J63 Electrical [Industrial] Services, in the not-to-exceed amount of \$5,000,000 for 730 consecutive calendar days to U.S. Electric Technologies, Inc.; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That this Commission hereby authorizes the Director to approves an increase of up to 1,095 calendar days to the contract duration contingency and to increase the not-to-exceed amount contingency by up to \$2,500,000.

Director Short:

In accordance with San Francisco Public Works (SFPW) Contract Administration policy and procedure, I am requesting your approval to recommend Award of Contract to the sole bidder for Job Order Contract J63 Electrical [Industrial] Services (Rebid) (Sourcing Event ID. 000008513).

On May 17, 2023, San Francisco Public Works (Public Works) advertised a formal contract for industrial electrical construction services via the Job Order Contracting Program. On June 21, 2023, no bids were received. The contract was rebid with authorization from the Director of Public Works on July 25, 2023 with the Micro-LBE Set-Aside Program requirement removed. The work on this contract will be accomplished by issuing task orders to the successful contractor during the term of the contract. The scope of work may include general electrical work, including medium-voltage 12kV and low-voltage 460V electrical power systems for industrial facilities, and associated work such as demolition, underground raceways, and system integration. One bid was received on August 9, 2023, from U.S. Electric Technologies, Inc. (U.S. Electric).

This contract is a Job Order Contract (JOC) with no predetermined work. Therefore, no engineer's estimate was provided. The required qualifications for Bidders were similar to those in previous solicitations of JOC contracts and are necessary to perform the work. In addition, the Micro-LBE Set-Aside Program requirement was removed to expand the bidder pool. SFPW performed outreach via SF City Partner and Public Works websites approximately two weeks prior to the rebid opening. Hence, neither further outreach nor removal or modification of certain requirements would result in more bids.

Given the above information, Public Works recommends award of contract to the sole bidder.
